

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INTENT OF THE VILLAGE OF RICHFIELD TO SELL PERSONAL PROPERTY INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO VEHICLES, EQUIPMENT, TOOLS, AND SUPPLIES, WHICH ARE NO LONGER NEEDED FOR PUBLIC USE OR ARE OBSOLETE OR UNFIT FOR THE USE FOR WHICH THEY WERE ACQUIRED, BY INTERNET AUCTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH OHIO REVISED CODE SECTION 721.15, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village of Richfield from time to time, including at the present time, has personal property including motor vehicles, road machinery, equipment, tools, and supplies, which is no longer needed for public use or is obsolete or unfit for the use for which it was acquired; and

WHEREAS, ORC §721.15 permits the sale of municipal property by Internet auction; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that selling personal property by Internet auction is likely to yield higher returns than other methods of sale; and

WHEREAS, ORC §721.15 requires that the legislative authority of a municipality adopt a Resolution during each calendar year expressing its intent to sell property by Internet auction;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

- SECTION 1. This council hereby expresses its intent to sell personal property that is not needed for public use, or is obsolete or unfit for the use for which it was acquired, by auction including but not limited to Internet auction for the calendar year 2017.
- SECTION 2. Such Internet auctions may occur throughout the year and shall be conducted by a representative or representatives selected by the Mayor. In addition to the requirements set forth herein, the Mayor or her representative is authorized to establish rules and regulations for the conduct of such Internet auctions.
- SECTION 3. The identity and contact information for the representative shall be posted on the Village's website at such time that property is offered for sale. Currently, the representative selected by the Mayor to conduct Internet auctions is:

- SECTION 4. Personal property sold by Internet auction shall be available for public bid for a minimum period of ten days, including Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays.
- SECTION 5. The Clerk of Council is authorized and directed to publish notice of this Resolution pursuant to Revised Code §721.15 in a newspaper of general circulation in

Richfield at least twice, the second and any subsequent notice of publication being published not less than 10 days nor more than 20 days after the previous notice.

SECTION 6. This Council further authorizes and directs the Clerk to post a notice of this Resolution in a conspicuous posting place in Village Hall as well as on the Village's website.

SECTION 7. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 8. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of Richfield, County of Summit, State of Ohio and for the further reason that it is in the interest of the Village of Richfield and its residents to hold an Internet auction as the earliest date permitted by law; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


