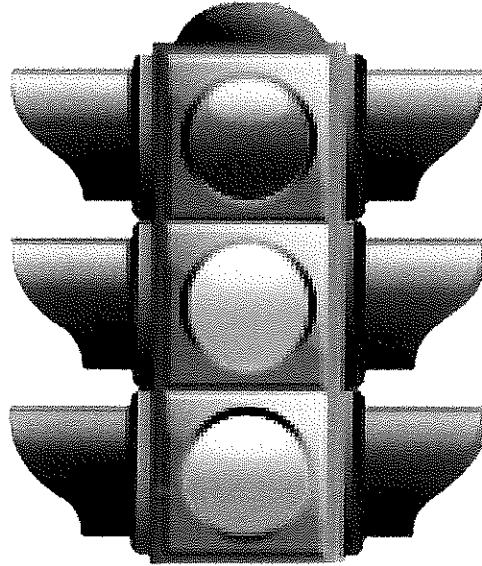


RICHFIELD SAFETY TOWN

2019



The Village of Richfield is offering a program designed to teach your child valuable safety rules before s/he enters kindergarten this fall **and is limited to children going into kindergarten the 2019-2020 school year.** Richfield Safety Town teaches lessons that include pedestrian and traffic safety, bike safety, stranger identification & safety, animal safety, gun safety, fire & tornado drill safety, address & telephone number drills, 911 instruction, self-defense, good touch-bad touch awareness, ALICE Training (minimal preparation for a school intruder), school bus safety, fireworks/burn safety, water safety & basic first aid. Classes are taught by police and fire department experts, an elementary school teacher, health care professionals and dedicated, supervised student volunteers.

Our program will be **held June 17th - 21st, 9:00am-12:00pm for five days with a 12:30pm graduation on Friday**, our last day. This year Richfield Safety Town will be held at Revere Middle School, 3195 Spring Valley Road, Akron, Ohio 44333 due to construction at Richfield Elementary. Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

As part of Safety Town your child will be introduced to a new training program to keep them safe at school. ALICE is a program that involves education on options in crisis and situational awareness. It is a proactive approach to a crisis.

ALICE stands for:

- A - Alert**
- L - Lockdown**
- I - Inform**
- C - Counter**
- E - Evacuate**

For students, training will include the following key points:

1. Reporting any suspicious activity, conversations, etc. to an authority figure - parent, teacher, police, principal.
2. Situational Awareness - using the information you have in a crisis to make the best decision to keep yourself safe.
3. Escape/Evacuation
4. Using surprise to stay safe

How is this different from the other procedure? Currently, schools use an intruder drill which focuses on locking down the building and keeping students in their locked classroom away from doors and windows. ALICE training adds options for this situation. ALICE encourages the use of real-time information with the intercom or other communications used to provide teachers and students with information throughout the situation. Students and staff can use this information to make decisions about how to react. One option is to barricade the classroom door making it even more difficult for the intruder to enter. Another option is evacuation if the intruder is in another part of the building. ALICE encourages students and staff to be aware of their surroundings and possible exit routes that exist.

The Richfield Police would like to invite you to participate in this training so that you can be fully aware of what is being taught to your child. The goal of this training is to begin your mental preparation of recognizing, assessing, and responding to immediate threats against you. This training is not designed to scare you into thinking there is a violent situation lurking around every corner. It is designed to prepare you to be a leader should a violent situation find you. ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate) will explain response options when faced with violence.

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

An integral part of the Richfield Safety Town is the Fire Department's Safety House. The communities of Bath, Copley, and Fairlawn also utilize this Safety House. The Safety House is a mobile, one story house used to show children how to exit a smoky dwelling. The simulated smoke is non-toxic "pretend theater" smoke that simulates the atmosphere of a burning house. A Firefighter, Police Officer, Safety Town Supervisor or Teacher will accompany the children at all times during the demonstration. Although the smoke is of non-toxic origin, **the manufacturer warns that individuals suffering from emphysema, asthma or diagnosed as having an allergic reaction to smoke or any other respiratory ailment should not be exposed to this artificial smoke.**

Your child will be instructed in the appropriate way to act, respond, and defend themselves when being picked up or grabbed by a stranger. This instruction is done by Police Officer Scott Dressler and would involve Officer Dressler physically picking up your child in practicing being taken by a stranger.

I allow my child to fully participate in the Basic Self-Defense Training.

Your child will be instructed in the appropriate behavior around animals. This instruction is done by the Richfield Animal Warden Cindy Clark and may involve touching of a dog under Warden Clark's close supervision. No child is ever forced to touch an animal if they express a fear of the animal. Please advise Mrs. Alaimo if your child is allergic to dogs and s/he will not be allowed to touch the animal.

I allow my child to fully participate in the animal instruction.

GASP (Guardians Advocating Child Safety and Protection) will be producing and providing free computer-generated discs for YOU to share with law enforcement if your child is missing. The disc includes: photos, video with voice and digital fingerprints. There is no data base so they collect this information and give it all back to you, the parents.
