

RESOLUTION NO. 35 -2008

Offered by All of Council

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING AN ASSESSMENT EQUALIZATION BOARD TO HEAR AND DETERMINE OBJECTIONS RELATIVE TO THE IMPROVEMENT OF CERTAIN PROPERTIES IN THE VILLAGE OF RICHFIELD BY CONSTRUCTING SANITARY SEWERS, TOGETHER WITH CONNECTIONS THEREFOR AND THE NECESSARY APPURTENANCES THERETO, IN MOTOR ROAD, RATENER ROAD, FIVE OAKS DRIVE AND HAROLD DRIVE BETWEEN CERTAIN TERMINI; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1.       Rick Alkire      ,       Dean Uher       and       Jeff Somerville      , three disinterested freeholders of the Village, are appointed to act as an Assessment Equalization Board to hear and determine all timely objections to the estimated special assessments for the cost of improving the properties described in Section 5 of Resolution No. 03-2008, adopted on March 4, 2008, by constructing sanitary sewers, together with connections therefor and the necessary appurtenances thereto, in the locations designated in that Resolution, and to equalize those special assessments as to them seems proper, in accordance with law and with Resolution No. 03-2008

SECTION 2. The Board shall meet for the above purpose in the Council Chambers in the Village Hall, 4410 West Streetsboro Road, Richfield, Ohio 44286, on   July 15, 2008   at   7:30   p.m., and upon the completion of its hearing and equalization shall report the equalized special assessments to Council. The Clerk of Council shall, at least five days prior to the first meeting, send a notice of the hearing by certified mail to all persons who filed timely written objections.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of the Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary in order to provide for the construction of the improvement, which is needed to eliminate existing and potential hazards to the health of the owners of the lots and lands to be assessed by providing sewage collection; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect

immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
