AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 153.04(D) OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE PERTAINING TO HOURS OF WORK AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Service Director have recommended a need for flexibility in scheduling hours of work for employees of the Department of Public Service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Section 153.04(d), "Work Hours," of the Administrative Code be amended to read as follows:

"153.04 WORK HOURS.

(a) through (c) * * *

(d) The normal work day week for employees of the Department of Public Service shall consist of ~~eight hours, starting at 7:30 a.m. and ending a 4:00 p.m. The normal meal time shall be from 11:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon.~~ forty hours. Days of the week and shift hours may vary to accommodate effective use of personnel and equipment in circumstances such as but not limited to longer daylight hours during summer months and seasonal work such as brush chipping in the spring and fall and snow plowing in the winter. A half hour off for lunch will be provided.

(e) * * *"

SECTION 2. That Section 153.04(d) as it existed prior to the effective date of this Ordinance be, and the same hereby is, repealed.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary in order to accommodate a flexibility in work schedules for the summer season; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
