

A RESOLUTION DECLARING POLICE DEPARTMENT SERVICE WEAPONS SURPLUS PROPERTY AND TRANSFERING OWNERSHIP OF SAID SERVICE WEAPONS TO RETIRING POLICE OFFICERS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Sergeant Nicholas Kostandaras, Officer Rick Lorek, and Officer Anthony Riviotta are scheduled to retire from the Richfield Police Department effective November 17, 2021; and


WHEREAS, the Village desires to recognize Sergeant Kostandaras', Officer Lorek's, and Officer Riviotta's service to the Village by presenting them with their respective service weapon upon retirement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Richfield, County of Summit, State of Ohio that:

- SECTION 1. Sergeant Nicholas Kostandaras' service weapon (Smith and Wesson, Generation 1, M&P 9mm pistol, Serial Number: HPA4534); Officer Rick Lorek's service weapon (Smith and Wesson, Generation 1, M&P 9mm pistol, Serial Number: HPR1875); and Officer Anthony Riviotta's (Smith and Wesson, Generation 1, M&P .45 caliber pistol, Serial Number: HAB7598) are Village property not necessary for public use, and thus surplus property that should be disposed of by transferring ownership of said service weapons to said police officers upon their retirement from the Richfield Police Department.
- SECTION 2. The ownership of a Smith and Wesson, Generation 1, M&P 9mm pistol, Serial Number: HPA4534) is transferred from the Village of Richfield to Nicholas Kostandaras upon his retirement; the ownership of a Smith and Wesson, Generation 1, M&P 9mm pistol, Serial Number: HPR1875 is transferred from the Village of Richfield to Rick Lorek upon his retirement; and the ownership of a Smith and Wesson, Generation 1, M&P .45 caliber pistol, Serial Number: HAB7598 is transferred from the Village of Richfield to Anthony Riviotta upon his retirement.
- SECTION 3. Transfer of ownership of said service weapons is complete upon the receipt of a release of claims relating to the transfer, possession, and/or use of the service weapon identified above to the Director of Law's satisfaction.
- SECTION 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of Richfield, County of Summit, State of Ohio and for the further purpose of ensuring that authorizing for the transfer of ownership of the service weapon from the Village prior to the retirement date identified above; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
