

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND SERVICE DIRECTOR TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR A PROGRAM YEAR 26 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and Service Director be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to make application for a Program Year 26 Community Development Block Grant in accordance with a memorandum from the Summit County Department of Development dated May 18, 1999, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein fully as if by reference.

SECTION 2. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary in order to make timely application for CDBG monies; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Documentation on how programs will be implemented.

- A. Emergency Medical Alert System
 - 1. This will alert a central monitoring system, which in turn notifies the Fire Department.
 - 2. Requested by physician.

- B. Emergency Access Key Lock-Box System
 - 1. Police & Fire Departments can gain access to homes that need emergency help.
 - 2. For people alone, frail or disabled.

- C. Winter Snow Removal for Elderly or Handicapped
 - 1. Bids will be received for this service and Contractors will be in charge of their own special areas.
 - 2. Applications must be made for this service.

- D. Septic System Pumping
 - 1. Request from elderly or handicapped.
 - 2. Applications must be made.

- E. Home Fix-Up (Spring & Fall) Leaves, Gutters, Trimming Hedges
 - 1. This service will be contracted.
 - 2. Applications must be made.

- F. Meals on Wheels
 - 1. Currently made by Pine Valley Care Center and distributed by volunteers.
 - 2. 2,000 meals annually, \$3.00 per meal.

All the above programs will be implemented by:

- 1. Informational meetings
- 2. Advertisement in local paper
- 3. Talking to existing senior groups
- 4. Using data base that Police have

Human Service Sub Committees will be monitoring these programs.

Basis of Project Budget

- A. Emergency Medical Alert System
Estimated cost of each unit is \$20.00 / per month, \$240.00 annually
x 25 units = \$6,000.00

- B. Emergency Access Key Lock-Box System
Estimated cost of each box is \$55.00 each, plus \$10.00 installation
fee = \$65.00. \$65.00
x 150 homes = \$9,700.00

- C. Winter Snow Removal
Estimated cost for each home is \$150.00 / winter
x 100 homes = \$15,000.00

- D. Septic System Pumping
Estimated cost for each home is \$80.00
x 25 homes = \$2,000.00

- E. Home Fix-Up (periodic Spring & Fall yard clean-up, gutter cleaning)
Estimated cost for each home is \$10.00 / hr. x 10 hrs. = \$100.00
x 75 homes = \$7,500.00

- F. Meals on Wheels
2000 meals annually
x \$3.00 each = \$6,000.00
