

**A RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION OF THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION  
STATE ISSUE 2 PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, in 1987 the Ohio Public Works Commission was created to provide financial assistance to local communities for public infrastructure improvements under the State Capital Improvements Program and the Local Transportation Improvements Program; and

WHEREAS, during the past nine years more than 6,000 projects totaling \$9.7 billion in infrastructure improvements for local Ohio communities have been realized; and

WHEREAS, since 1988 the Ohio Public Works Commission (State Issue 2 Program) has provided the Village of Richfield approximately \$1.8 million in financial assistance towards the completion of seven new infrastructure projects and infrastructure renewal and rehabilitation projects; including the Brecksville Road Storm Sewer Project, Everett/Brecksville Road traffic signal replacement, Sanitary Sewer District No. 1 Project, Broadview Road/Route 303 traffic signal replacement, engineering traffic signal replacements and turn lane modification Brecksville Road/Route 303 project and Brecksville Road Water Line Extension Project; and

WHEREAS, without this funding assistance many of these projects would not have been possible; and


WHEREAS, the Village of Richfield wishes to express its sincere appreciation to the Ohio Public Works Commission, particularly Commission Director W. Laurence Bicking and District 8 Program Representative Michael Miller for their objective decision making, technical assistance and devoted service toward ensuring that our valuable infrastructure systems are maintained; and

WHEREAS, the Issue 2 Program approved by Ohio voters in 1987 will expire by law after completion of the current round ten funding cycle in 1995-1996; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and members of Council of the Village of Richfield, Ohio, on behalf of its citizens hereby acknowledge the exceptional services provided by the Ohio Public Works Committee. Furthermore, the Mayor and Council respectfully encourage its citizens to support State Issue 2 on the ballot on November 7, 1995, to enable the continuation of the Ohio Public Works Commission and its worthwhile program of providing financial assistance to local communities throughout the State of Ohio for capital infrastructure improvements; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


