

RESOLUTION 7-1992

Offered by Mayor Waszak and Mr. Nehrenz

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING AN ASSESSMENT EQUALIZATION BOARD TO HEAR OBJECTIONS RELATIVE TO THE IMPROVEMENT OF CERTAIN PROPERTIES IN THE VILLAGE OF RICHFIELD BY CONSTRUCTING SANITARY SEWERS, TOGETHER WITH SERVICE CONNECTIONS, AND SANITARY SEWAGE PUMPING STATIONS, TOGETHER WITH THE NECESSARY APPURTENANCES THERETO, IN CERTAIN DESIGNATED LOCATIONS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, Ohio, that:

- SECTION 1:** Frank Hacka, Regina Jandry and Gordon Tibbs, three disinterested freeholders of this Village, are appointed to act as an Assessment Equalization Board to hear and determine all timely written objections to the estimated special assessments for the cost of improving certain properties in the Village of Richfield by constructing sanitary sewers, together with service connections, and sanitary sewage pumping stations, together with the necessary appurtenances thereto, in certain designated locations, and to equalize those special assessments as to them seems proper in accordance with law and with Resolution No. 2-1992 adopted by this Council on January 2, 1992.
- SECTION 2:** The Board shall first meet for that purpose in Council Chambers, 4410 West Streetsboro Road, Richfield, Ohio 44286, on March 4, 1992, at 7:00 p.m., and upon the completion of its hearings and equalization shall report the equalized special assessments to Council. The Clerk of Council shall, at least five days prior to the first meeting, send a notice of the hearing by certified mail to all persons who filed timely written objections.
- SECTION 3:** This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of this Village and for the further reason that this Resolution is required to be immediately effective to provide for the construction of the improvement, which is needed to eliminate existing hazards to the health and property of the residents of the Village; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor.
