Offered by All Members of Council and Mayor Waszak

A RESOLUTION TO COMMEND THE RICHFIELD COLISEUM AND THE CLEVELAND CAVALIERS' BASKETBALL TEAM FOR FIFTEEN YEARS OF PROFESSIONAL PROGRESS AND EXTRAORDINARY COMMUNITY COMMITMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Ohio




SECTION 2: The Mayor and Council of the Village of Richfield commend the Gund Brothers for combining progressive management and community commitment in their business strategy.


