

A RESOLUTION URGING THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO
TO PASS H.B. 661 MANDATING RECYCLED PAPER IN ALL NEWS
PRINT DISTRIBUTED IN THE STATE OF OHIO AND DECLARING
AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, concern for the environment and solid waste management needs to become a primary consideration of all residents of the State of Ohio, and

WHEREAS, RECYLING is gaining greater acceptance by these residents, and

WHEREAS, there exists a great need to develop a larger demand for recycled newspapers which are easily collected and are now in greater supply than the demand, and

WHEREAS, House Bill No. 661 which mandates recycled paper in all newsprint distributed in the State of Ohio has passed the House and was sent to the Senate for consideration,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Ohio:


SECTION 1: The Council of the Village of Richfield, Ohio hereby urges the passage of H.B. 661 mandating recycled paper in all newsprint distributed in the State of Ohio.

SECTION 2: The Council recognizes the need to create a market for recycled paper and the need to assist all municipalities in meeting state mandated requirements to reduce the volume of trash delivered to landfills.


SECTION 3: The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Ohio Senate, State Senator Roy Ray and State Senator Richard H. Finan.

SECTION 4: This Resolution is determined to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety for the reason to promote recycling and solid waste management, and provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date provided by law.
