

AN RESOLUTION TO URGE THE CONGRESS TO PASS A CLEAN WATER ACT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Congress has had before it a question of the re-authorization of the Clean Water Act, and

WHEREAS, the President vetoed the bill on November 6, 1986 after Congress adjourned for the year 1986, and


WHEREAS, the need for such legislation continues.


Now Therefore Be It Resolved by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Ohio:

- Section 1: This Council finds and determines that the provisions of the Clean Water Act of 1986 should be passed by Congress.
- Section 2: Council further finds and determines that such legislation is in the best interests of the citizens of this Village and promotes the quality of the environment within which we live.
- Section 3: Council urges the Congress to re-authorize the Clean Water Act and to pass legislation the terms and conditions of which are the same as the Clean Water Act of 1986.
- Section 4: The Clerk is authorized and directed to serve this Resolution 4-1987 upon the leaders of the House of Representatives and the Senate.
- Section 5: This Resolution is determined to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety for the reason of the beneficial impact of the environmental legislation and provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in

force from and after its approval by the Mayor;  
otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from  
and after the earliest date provided by law.
