

AN RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO HOUSE BILL 367 WITH RESPECT TO ANNEXATION, NOW PENDING BEFORE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly has enacted a comprehensive scheme of laws to provide for the adjustment of boundaries between municipalities and townships and,

WHEREAS, the laws relating to annexation provide flexibility and are responsive to the needs of those persons who are effected thereby and,

WHEREAS, any moratorium of the operation of the laws relating to annexation would inhibit changes in boundaries of municipalities caused by normal growth and expansion,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Ohio:

Section 1: That the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, Ohio is opposed to any moratorium on the operation of the laws relating to annexation.

Section 2: That proposed House Bill 367, relating to a two year moratorium on annexation pending a legislative study, now before the House Elections and Township Committee of the Ohio House of Representatives is not in the public interest and should be defeated.

Section 3: This Resolution is determined to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety for the reason of the pendency of House Bill 367 and provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take

effect and be in force from and after the earliest date provided by law.
