A RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO THE APPLICATION OF WESTERN RESERVE TELEPHONE COMPANY FOR AN INCREASE IN RATES AND CHARGES FOR TELEPHONE SERVICE NOW PENDING BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Western Reserve Telephone Company has filed an application with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio requesting adjustments and increases in telephone rates, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Richfield finds and determines that the Western Reserve Telephone Company seeks rate adjustments and increases when the company now earns a fair rate of return on its invested capital,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, Ohio:

Section 1: The Council and Mayor of the Village of Richfield oppose any adjustment or increase in telephone rates for the Western Reserve Telephone Company, as filed with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.

Section 2: This Council and Mayor believe the economic well-being of the region will be affected adversely by an increase of telephone rates and that the Western Reserve Telephone Company must not be permitted to increase the burden for telephone services.


Section 3: The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to file certified copies of this Resolution with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.

Section 4: This Resolution is determined to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety for the reason of time requirements to lodge a protest and provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date provided by law.
