

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING FUNDS THROUGH THE LITTER PREVENTION & RECYCLING PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THE OHIO LITTER CONTROL ACT OF 1980, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Millions of dollars are spent in Ohio each year to remove unsightly and unsanitary litter from along roads, streets, waterways, recreational places and other public areas; and

WHEREAS, The Council of The Village of Richfield, Ohio recognizes the existence of a litter problem within the boundaries of the Village, and the need to address the problem at the local level; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Litter Control Act of 1980, provides, through the Department of Natural Resources, Office of Litter Prevention & Recycling for the allocation of funds in the form of grants for the purpose of supplemental local Litter Prevention Programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF RICHFIELD, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, STATE OF OHIO:

- SECTION 1: That the Council hereby endorses and supports a Litter Prevention Program for the Village of Richfield and authorizes the ^{EXPENDITURE OF} ~~NECESSARY~~ funds necessary to implement said program, if approved, as indicated in its application.
- SECTION 2: That the Mayor is hereby authorized to apply for and, if awarded, administer a grant to implement said single project for the Litter Containment.
- SECTION 3: That the Council of The Village of Richfield hereby requests the Department of Natural Resources, Office of Litter Prevention & Recycling, to consider and fund its application project.
- SECTION 4: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council, and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5: This Resolution is determined to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety for the reason that it is imperative that the grant application be filed in a timely manner, and provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date provided by law.
