

RESOLUTION NO. 75-2013 (AMENDED 11/13/2013)

Offered by All of Council

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXPEND FUNDS FOR A HOLIDAY PARTY FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE VILLAGE OF RICHFIELD AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, this Council desires to authorize the Mayor to expend up to eight hundred fifty dollars (\$850.00) for a Holiday Party for the employees of the Village of Richfield; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines that such Holiday Party is in the public interest of the Village of Richfield, to honor the Village's employees, and the Holiday Party constitutes a valid public purpose for the expenditure of Village funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor be and is hereby authorized and directed to expend up to eight hundred fifty dollars (\$850.00) to provide for a Holiday Party for the employees of the Village of Richfield and administrative officials.

SECTION 2. That Council hereby finds, determines and declares that the expenditure authorized herein serves a valid public purpose and is an appropriate use of Village funds.

SECTION 3. That actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this legislation were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the law.

SECTION 4. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of Richfield, County of Summit, State of Ohio and for the further purpose of immediately authorizing the aforementioned Holiday Party; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and the Finance Director be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to enter into an agreement for legal services with the Summit County Defender's Commission for defense of indigent defendants, a copy of which Agreement is attached here to as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein fully as if by reference.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force upon the approval of the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

The Finance Department requests first reading on the 2014 agreement with the Summit County Public Defenders Commission. Adoption will be considered at the December 3rd, Council meeting. They have not sent the actual agreement yet but have indicated the fee will remain the same for 2014.

This is an annual agreement to obtain the services of the Public Defender to provide legal counsel to indigent persons charged with a violation of the Village's Codified Ordinances in Akron Municipal Court during 2014. The judge determines if the individual is indigent in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code and the Ohio Administrative Code.

The Village will be billed \$160.00 per case, the same rate as the 2013 fee. The State Public Defender will reimburse a prorated share of the payment back to the Village. The current reimbursement rate is approximately 25%. To-date, the Village did not have any indigent Codified Ordinance cases during 2012 or 2013. In 2011, the Village had two indigent Codified Ordinance cases that cost us \$320.
