

A RESOLUTION DECLARING CERTAIN PROPERTY NO LONGER NEEDED FOR PUBLIC USE, AND AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE TO DISPOSE OF SAID EQUIPMENT BY INTERNET AUCTION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, R.C. 721.15 allows for this Council to adopt a Resolution authorizing the sale of personal property which is no longer needed for public use, or is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was required, by internet auction; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to sell the surplus property via internet action; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director and Fire Chief have recommended that the Village utilize GovDeals.com for purposes of Internet auctions of surplus personal property of the Village; and

WHEREAS, this Council has received a recommendation from the Fire Chief that the following personal property is no longer needed for public use, is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was acquired, and, thus, is surplus property and should be disposed of:

12, ½ HP WAYNE DALTON GARAGE DOOR OPENERS AND REMOTE CONTROLS

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, County of Summit, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the following personal property is no longer needed for public use, is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was acquired, and, thus, is surplus property and available for disposition by Internet auction:

12, ½ HP WAYNE DALTON GARAGE DOOR OPENERS AND REMOTE CONTROLS

The Internet auction shall be conducted pursuant to a contract with GovDeals.com, based upon the recommendation of the Finance Director and Fire Chief.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare and for the further reason that it is necessary to facilitate the auction of these items of personal property at the earliest possible time in order to maximize the value


recoverable by the public entity; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
