

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND SERVICE DIRECTOR TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR A PROGRAM YEAR 25 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and Service Director be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to make application for a Program Year 25 Community Development Block Grant in accordance with a memorandum from the Summit County Department of Development dated July 20, 1998 a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein fully as if by reference.

SECTION 2. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary in order to make timely application for CDBG monies; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

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Enclosed is a blank proposal for the 25<sup>th</sup> (1999) year of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Communities that are interested in submitting a proposal for an eligible CDBG project or activity should complete the enclosed form and return it **no later than 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 10, 1998**. Read all instructions carefully because incomplete proposals will not be processed.

All eligible communities are encouraged to participate in the 25<sup>th</sup> (1999) year of the CDBG program. I am, however, advising communities that have **three or more years of unspent CDBG funds** still on account to consider not submitting a proposal for the 25<sup>th</sup> (1999) year so that your community can concentrate on expending CDBG allocations from prior funding years. Unspent CDBG funds can be recaptured if they are not expended in a timely manner. If your community does not submit a proposal for the 25<sup>th</sup> (1999) year, your community will still be eligible to submit a project in the 26<sup>th</sup> (2000) year of the CDBG program.

Please send written notification if your community chooses not to submit a proposal for the 25<sup>th</sup> (1999) year of the CDBG program.
