

ORDINANCE 38-1989

Offered by Mayor Waszak and Council

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING SECTION 921.06 OF THE STREETS, UTILITIES AND PUBLIC SERVICES CODE DECLARING THE INTENT AND POLICY OF THE VILLAGE OF RICHFIELD TO HAVE ITS SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM SERVE ONLY THOSE PROPERTIES LOCATED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE VILLAGE OF RICHFIELD AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Richfield has determined that there is a need to construct a sanitary sewer system to serve the properties located within the Village of Richfield; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this determination, the Village is embarking on a program to construct a major interceptor sewer in Brecksville Road through the entire length of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the capacity of said interceptor sewer is limited; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Village to control the development of properties feeding into the systems so as not to exceed capacity; and

WHEREAS, the local costs and expenses for constructing and maintaining said sanitary sewer system will be borne by the residents of, and/or owners of property located within the Village of Richfield; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that it is necessary to limit the number of properties served by said sanitary sewer system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That Section 921.06 of the Streets, Utilities and Public Services Code be enacted to read as follows:

"921.06 SEWER SYSTEM TO SERVE VILLAGE

It is hereby declared to be the intent and policy of the Village of Richfield to limit the number of properties served by its sanitary sewer system by allowing said sanitary sewer system to serve only those properties which are located within the boundaries of the Village of Richfield, State of Ohio."

SECTION 2: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to limit the number of properties served by the aforesaid sanitary sewer system and provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date provided by law.
