

RESOLUTION 40 -1989

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT FOR LITTER LAW ENFORCEMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, during the Summer of 1988, the Village of Richfield caused application to be made to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for a litter control grant; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Richfield has been recently notified that its grant application has been approved; and

WHEREAS, the grant application will consist of the receipt of \$9,239.00 for litter law enforcement of which amount \$8,489.00 will go for salaries and \$750.00 will be used for vehicle expenses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That the litter control grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources in the amount of \$9,239.00 for litter law enforcement be, and the same hereby is, accepted by the Village of Richfield.

SECTION 2: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason to control litter during the summer months; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its signature by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date provided by law.
